15th Sunday after Trinity - Feast of the Blessed Virgin Mary

We can sometimes take our regular cycle of prayer, feasts and festivals for granted.

Every week there are various days which honour or remember specific saints or events in the life of the wider Church. Recent weekday remembrances have included Aiden, Bishop and Missionary of the 7th Century; John Bunyan, the 17th Century writer of The Pilgrim's Progress; and the beheading of John The Baptist. These people or events are remembered in weekday services and in Morning and Evening Prayer which Simon and I say publicly in St Mary's on weekdays.

Most people who attend church will have encountered those remembrances and festivals which we keep on Sundays such as All Saints Day on 1st November or Harvest festivals in September and October.

The Roman Catholic Church has had a lectionary for centuries and it revises it from time to time. Protestant churches throughout the world have also developed their own lectionaries. The set of remembrances which we, and many mainstream protestant churches use, is an harmonisation of all these separate ones. We call it the Revised Common

Lectionary and it also gives us our Sunday readings.

One of the great things about a lectionary is that it produces a varied and interesting set of things on which to ponder. These remembrances remind us that the Christian life is not all about what is happening to us now but about our lives within the context of thousands of years.

Today we celebrate the Blessed Virgin Mary. There is much that we can learn from her life. She was strong. She had courage. She was willing to take huge risks for God's glory. Let's celebrate Mary today and let's be thankful for a lectionary which gives us the opportunity to engage with so many riches.

# First Reading: Isaiah 61.10-11
