Black Lives Matter has given this an extra sharpness and urgency this year, and we have been made more aware of the way in which the slave trade shaped our history and economy during that era. The formal ending of slavery across the world has not ended the actual practice, and people are still abused and exploited by others, and denied control over their own lives. Pray this week for the work and witness of the **Mothers' Union**, within our Diocese and around the world. The Diocesan Advisory Committee is scheduled to meet this week. Pray for all that is being done to ensure our church buildings are in good repair, but also that they are able to provide for the ministry and worship needed today.
