Prayer & readings for today

Collect

Risen Christ, faithful shepherd of your Father's sheep: teach us to hear your voice and to follow your command, that all your people may be gathered in to one flock, to the glory of God the Father. **Amen.**

First Reading

Reader: A reading from the Book of the Acts of the Apostles.

The next day their rulers, elders, and scribes assembled in Jerusalem, with Annas the high priest, Caiaphas, John, and Alexander, and all who were of the high-priestly family. When they had made the prisoners stand in their midst, they inquired, 'By what power or by what name did you do this?' Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them, 'Rulers of the people and elders, if we are questioned today because of a good deed done to someone who was sick and are asked how this man has been healed, let it be known to all of you, and to all the people of Israel, that this man is standing before you in good health by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead. This Jesus is "the stone that was rejected by you, the builders; it has become the cornerstone."

There is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among

mortals by which we must be saved.' *Reader*: This is the word of the Lord.

All: Thanks be to God.

Gospel Reading

I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. The hired hand, who is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away—and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. The hired hand runs away because a hired hand does not care for the sheep. I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father. And I lay down my life for the sheep. I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd. For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it up again. I have received this command from my Father.'

Letter from Derek

In a week of heart-rending news stories, I have been most disturbed by an interview with the ten-year old son of a farming family who was explaining how the current spread of an endemic infectious disease is affecting both sheep and lambs. I was taken with his knowledge of both the sheep and the illness, with the depth of feeling for the animals he knew so well, and with the sacrifices he was preparing to make to minimise the impact of disease on his flock. In an area where sheep farming is so very important these views will have been echoed in countless farm kitchens, in animal pens and in market gatherings – and all these conversations will have been characterised by this sincerity, deep knowledge and determination to find a cure.

Jesus knew what he was talking about when he characterised himself as a good shepherd. He wanted his flock to be carefully tended, nurtured, and supported in their growth. He recognised that hired hands would lack commitment, that they would easily be deflected from their duties and that they could be influenced by others.

Jesus also spoke of other sheep, at his time, the Gentiles, but he also stressed that new shepherds would extend the kingdom through determination, consideration, and nurturing. As we begin the process of searching for a Rector we have to recall three ideas from this passage in John. We have to remember that we are of one flock and recall the togetherness of established groups; we have to accept the shepherd chosen for us, as did the growing flocks of the young church, and we have to live according to the Shepherds' rules. For us, this is the basis of our living faith that we can all become one flock. Amen.
