Collect

Risen, ascended Lord, as we rejoice at your triumph, fill your Church on earth with power and compassion, that all who are estranged by sin may find forgiveness and know your peace, to the glory of God the Father. **Amen.**

First Reading

Reader: A reading from the Book of the Acts of the Apostles.

In those days Peter stood up among the believers (together the crowd numbered about one hundred and twenty people) and said, 'Friends, the scripture had to be fulfilled, which the Holy Spirit through David foretold concerning Judas, who became a guide for those who arrested Jesus— for he was numbered among us and was allotted his share in this ministry. So one of the men who have accompanied us throughout the time that the Lord Jesus went in and out among us, beginning from the baptism of John until the day when he was taken up from us—one of these must become a witness with us to his resurrection.' So they proposed two, Joseph called Barsabbas, who was also known as Justus, and Matthias. Then they prayed

and said, 'Lord, you know everyone's heart. Show us which one of these two you have chosen to take the place in this ministry and apostleship from which Judas turned aside to go to his own place.' And they cast lots for them, and the lot fell on Matthias; and he was added to the eleven apostles. [Acts of the Apostles 1.15-17, 1.21-end]

Reader: This is the word of the Lord.

All: Thanks be to God.

Gospel Reading

'I have made your name known to those whom you gave me from the world. They were yours, and you gave them to me, and they have kept your word. Now they know that everything you have given me is from you; for the words that you gave to me I have given to them, and they have received them and know in truth that I came from you; and they have believed that you sent me. I am asking on their behalf; I am not asking on behalf of the world, but on behalf of those whom you gave me, because they are yours. All mine are yours, and yours are mine; and I have been glorified in them. And now I am no longer in the world, but they are in the world, and I am coming to you. Holy Father, protect them in your name that you have given me, so that they may be one, as we are one. While I was with them, I protected them in your name that you have given me. I guarded them, and not one of them was lost except the one destined to be lost, so that the scripture might be fulfilled. But now I am coming to you, and I speak these things in the world so that they may have my joy made complete in themselves. I have given them your word, and the world has hated them because they do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. I am not asking you to take them out of the world, but I ask you to protect them from the evil one. They do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth. As you have sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world. And for their sakes I sanctify myself, so that they also may be sanctified in truth. [John 17.6-19]

Letter from David

Last week Voyager 1 spoke again. Launched in 1977, the craft has visited outer planets of the solar system and is now speeding on into deep space. It relayed information back to earth until it fell silent last year, but after repairs carried out remotely (radio instructions took over 22 hours to reach it) it is communicating again. It is now 24 billion kilometres away and it will send signals until its power runs out. Scientists think it will then continue for ever - in Buzz Lightyear's words: 'To infinity and beyond'. It is a modern miracle and it tells us about the world in which we live.

Last Thursday, the Church marked the Ascension, the event in which Jesus departed from his disciples for the last time. It is usually accepted that he moved upwards through the clouds, but if you look at the final accounts about him in the Gospels you will find that Luke alone mentions his ascension as an event (though some of the earliest versions of his Gospel omit this). Only in the Acts of the Apostles is it stated plainly that when Jesus left his disciples he was 'lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight'. Here, Acts was following the common view of the time that God and heaven were 'up there'.

Where did Jesus go? Can we, knowing what we do about the universe, accept the view that has been handed down? The truth the first Christian authors convey is that in his resurrection Jesus showed he was one with God, a truth at the heart of Christianity. The challenge for us is how to explain this in the world we know today.

Life Link Chaplaincy Grant – We are delighted that our application to the **Benefact Trust** has resulted in a grant of £27,000 across 3 years for our Life Link Chaplaincy. This should mean that we are now financially water-tight on this project; but we are also emboldened that a national funding body is prepared to put their trust in our exciting project in this way. The job advert will be placed very soon and we look forward to more exciting developments.

Grant funding – We are grateful to the Herefordshire Historic Churches Trust for a recent donation of £5,000 toward the cost of improving and enlarging the nave platform in St Mary's. The Friends have also received funding from Ross Town Council, The Edward Cadbury Charitable Trust, William Allen Young Charitable Trust for this project.
